

Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,


During last week teachers, parents and many of our students have been able to reflect on and review the learning progress of students over the last two terms and set goals for the next semester.

Both born and raised in the Republic of Kiribati, Juniko and Tuata have participated in the novitiate program for the last two years whilst living in the Lawson community of Good Samaritan Sisters. In the coming weeks, Juniko and Tuata will return to Kiribati where they will continue with a study program and engage in local ministry. The Congregation of the Sisters of Good Samaritan of the Order of St Benedict, known affectionately as the Good Sams, is Australia's first 'homegrown' congregation of Catholic religious women. Today, there are around 235 sisters (including our own Sister Monica Armstrong) living and working throughout Australia, in Japan, Kiribati, and the Philippines.

School Banking

Thank you for banking through the Commonwealth Bank via our school on a Tuesday. Due to the volume of banking conducted through our school we have needed to make some necessary changes for you to please take note of:

- 1. Please limit money amounts to \$50 and under.
- 2. If deposits do not match the deposit slip then banking will be returned.
- 3. If deposit slips are not completed then banking will be returned.

Carrying excessive amounts of money in a child's schoolbag is not the school's responsibility. If your child wishes to bank a large amount of money such as a gift etc, please only bank the minimum through school banking and take the remainder to the bank, or bank the money in smaller instalments over several weeks.

Threadworms

Due to reports of recent cases in our school we ask that parents please read the following information.

Threadworms are commonly found in preschool and school aged children. They often occur in more than one family member. Threadworms look like white threads, about 8mm long and occur in the lower intestine, but come out of the bottom at night to lay their eggs. This causes very annoying itching in the area especially at night. Threadworms can be spread easily when children carry the eggs on their fingers from scratching back to their mouth with their hands. They can also be spread indirectly, in food, dust, or other articles. Eggs can survive up to two weeks outside the body. Once the eggs are swallowed the whole process begins again.

Threadworm infection is not usually serious and easily cured with medication. Repeat infections are very common and precautions need to be taken to prevent this and the spread of threadworms to others. **Human beings cannot and do not catch threadworms from animals.**

If your child has threadworms, they may:

- Have an itchy bottom which may become red and inflamed from scratching.
- Be irritable and generally 'out of sorts'.
- Not sleep very well.

Your doctor or chemist will advise you on the best treatment. It is very important that good hygiene practices are also put in place such as thorough washing of hands with soap after using the toilet and before eating. Further information available at NSW Health website.
