Dear St Thomas Aguinas Families,

This week I had the privilege of speaking to a group of Masters in Teaching students at the University of Western Sydney about what teaching is really like and why it is such an important and rewarding vocation. I say vocation precisely because I firmly believe that teaching isn't simply a job, but a calling. A vocation is about having a vision, being passionate, being committed, about being the master of your craft, and building strong, honest, trusting relationships with your students that allow you to get the best out of them and that helps them to discover what they can do for themselves.

The talk was entitled. We Take Care of Our Own after a song written by one of my musical heroes, Bruce Springsteen. The song, for me, epitomises what the vocation of teaching is all about. It's about taking care of every single student who sits in our classrooms, it's about making sure that their talents and aptitudes are nurtured and catered for. It's about empowering our students to take their place in the world, confident that they can contribute successfully and positively to their world. It's also about ensuring that we, as teachers, form strong caring relationships with our students and their families because only from here does true, deep learning occur.

Ultimately, the power of education lies in the fact that it is transformational. It opens up the possibility of changing lives, of things being different, of people pursuing dreams. In my personal case, as I'm sure in many of yours, education transformed the trajectory of my family in a generation. My hardworking and beautiful grandparents in Italy were illiterate peasants who had no choice other than a life of servitude and meagre means.

But my parents, although themselves lacking in formal education, knew innately that it was critical in opening up the world of future possibilities for their children. Thankfully, I was

blessed to have been taught by a number of inspirational and dedicated teachers and leaders whilst at school. Their teaching wasn't simply about knowledge but also wisdom - formation and information linked and connected to the real world, its values and truths.

This week many families and teachers met in order to discuss and celebrate their child's progress in their learning journey. These meetings are also about furthering the essential relationship between home and school so that together we can take care of our own.


The concert will feature Peter Kearney on vocals, guitar & narration with Roma Dix on flute.



Our annual Grandparents Day will be held in Week 4, on Thursday 7 August commencing at 12 noon. The day will involve a liturgy, picnic in the school grounds and open classrooms during the afternoon. More information will be sent home shortly.

#### **Enrolment Information and Reminders**

The school is currently receiving a number of enrolment enquiries for 2015. With this in mind it is timely to outline the criteria used for enrolment in our Diocese. St Thomas Aquinas is required to follow the Diocesan Enrolment Policy. Information regarding enrolments can be viewed on the Catholic Education Office web site <a href="https://www.parra.catholic.edu.au">www.parra.catholic.edu.au</a>. The Diocesan Policy states eligibility as follows:

• Children whose fifth birthday occurs on or before 31 July are eligible for enrolment for Kindergarten that year.

Enrolment preference is given, in order, to:

- baptised children of Catholic families who live in the local parish
- baptised children of Catholic families from other parishes
- baptised children of other Christian denominations
- non-Catholics

Catholic schools have a strong religious dimension and people of other faiths who wish to enrol in Catholic schools should be willing to participate in the religious activities of the school. Non-Catholic students are accepted into Catholic schools in accordance with each school's enrolment vacancies. Siblings of children already enrolled in the school are considered by the same criteria above. However, within each of these categories, a sibling of a child already enrolled will have preference over an applicant who does not have a sibling enrolled in the school. Special consideration may be given to children of non-Catholic families for:

- compassionate reasons
- family situations requiring a special pastoral approach
- parents' intentions regarding their own and their children's faith development
- family circumstances involving family relocation
- enrolment of siblings

Statements have been sent home to all families for the current term. Due date for payment is 19 August. Unless you have a formal arrangement, please pay by the due date. Otherwise please contact Deborah Lawrence, School Finance Secretary, to organise an arrangement.
