Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

In an address to Italian educators assembled in St Peters Square Pope Francis expressed the following thoughts about education:

"It's in school, where one learns truth, goodness and beauty". "It is where children learn the three languages that a mature person needs to know: the language of the **mind**, the language of the **heart**, and the language of the **hands**".

Pope Francis then went on to say:

"This is why there are so many subjects (at school) — because development is the result of different elements that act together and stimulate intelligence, knowledge, the emotions, the body, and so on."

The Pontiff's words lead us to some essential truths about children and learning:

- That the first educators of children are their parents and their families
- School plays an important part in collaborating with parents and families in helping children to learn

The Pope also underscored that all learning needs to be holistic and varied - involving mind, heart and body. Holistic learning seeks to develop children, academically, emotionally, socially and spiritually and.

In this newsletter we are able to recount some of the main events that have occurred recently at STA. Through these we can see examples of the varied learning opportunities that students have had to develop themselves as whole and unique children of God.

#### **Mercy Cross Visit to STA**

This year Pope Francis has called for a more merciful and inclusive Church in which we are all called to give consolation, forgiveness and understanding to those in need. In response to this Year of Mercy, the relics of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop and St Teresa of Kolkata

accompanied by a Mercy Cross have been on a pilgrimage through the Diocese of Parramatta.

On Tuesday 1 November it was our turn as a school, to host the Cross and relics. The liturgy commenced with a procession from the Parish Church leading to the COLA and involved all students and staff. Through prayer, scripture, song, movement and veneration we were able to contemplate and gain a greater appreciation of Mercy that we all carry in our hearts.



We thank Joanne Toohey (REC) for her organisation of this memorable event and also the Year 6 students led by Virginia Fortunat for their striking and reflective interpretation during the liturgy.

The program is educational in nature and does not provide therapy.

Our school has 3 staff members led by Sister Monica Armstrong sgs who are trained to facilitate small group lessons in Seasons for Growth. The groups will shortly be concluding their program with a small celebration to mark this milestone. #### School Opal Card – Online Applications for 2017 Now Open

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online process for you to submit school travel applications. **Therefore, we will now be able to process your applications online**, making it unnecessary for parents to submit a paper form to the school for endorsement.



A new application is required for students starting school or for those who have not had a travel pass before; for students progressing from Year 2 to 3 or Year 6 to 7; for students changing schools, and for students whose personal details have changed, such as address etc. NB. Students who do not qualify for free travel may be eligible for a Term Bus Pass instead. If you already have a current School Opal card that does not need updating DO NOT THROW IT OUT as you'll be able to use it for the 2017 school year.
