Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

All schools in the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) have an objective to improve learning and teaching for all students. This entails utilising both qualitative and quantitative data to make informed judgements about the next steps in the individual progress of students as well as our school wide growth.

As educators this means continually looking at ways to refine and improve our practice. Encompassing all of this is the need for teachers to know and educate each student holistically – spiritually, academically, socially, emotionally and aesthetically.

During the early part of the school year all teachers have been engaged in gaining relevant and informative baseline assessment data on each student. At our whole school assembly on Monday we formally "launched" our 3 School Learning Goals for this year with our students and members of the community in attendance. Outlined below are our 3 School Learning Goals for 2017 including a brief description of actions to achieve these goals.

# **Religious Education Goal**

#### All students will deepen their understanding of Christian Scripture.

In achieving this goal teachers will draw on a variety of strategies and resources to enhance student's scriptural understanding. This deeper understanding will incorporate students using the 3 senses of scriptural understanding – the Literal sense (What, who, where, when?); the Spiritual sense (What does this scripture teach us?) and Application sense (What can I do for others? How does this scripture help me love God or Jesus more?).





# **Literacy Goal**

# All students will improve their writing with a focus on text cohesion.

In achieving this goal students will engage in daily modelled, shared, guided and independent writing. In order to improve the quality of their writing teachers will provide quality feedback to students as well as students becoming better versed in self-assessing their work using writing exemplars and shared success criteria.

# **Numeracy Goal**

# All students will improve their problem-solving skills.

In achieving this goal students will be developing their skills in choosing effective strategies in order to reason, solve, prove and communicate mathematical problems. Our focus in this area is particularly in using multiplication and division strategies.

These goals are our focus areas for the year and are designed to respond to student learning needs and the related professional learning that influences this student learning. Sharing and

helping students and parents understand the direction of our School Learning Goals is an important step on the road to realising them and celebrating their achievement.

- 1. Keeps picking on you AGAIN and AGAIN and tries to make you feel bad.
- 2. Says or does LOTS of mean things that upset you.
- 3. Makes fun of you A LOT.
- **4.** Tries to STOP YOU from joining in or making others not like you.
- 5. KEEPS hurting you such as hitting or punching you.

Schoolwork Personality

#### Bullying can happen:

In person or online. It might be something people can see or might be hidden.

#### What it isn't:

## It is important to understand the DIFFERENCE between BULLYING and ARGUING or CONFLICT.

Sometimes you might have a fight or argument with someone.

It happens once, it is not bullying even though it can be upsetting.

It is also not bullying if you sometimes fight or argue with a friend and you can sort it out.

#### Bullying is not okay:

You have a right to feel safe.

If you don't feel safe, TALK about it with your parents or other family member, a teacher or trusted grown up who will listen to you.

- o It's NEVER okay to BE MEAN.
- o It's NEVER okay to HURT OTHERS.
- o It's NEVER okay to put someone down.

#### **Creative Arts Alive at STA**

St Thomas Aquinas Springwood has a proud tradition of participation in all areas of the Creative Arts including Visual Arts, Music, Dance and Drama. This culture of music extends to the use of live music to enliven and deepen the liturgical, faith and community life of the school.

The creative arts at STA are seen as vital in providing learning opportunities for students that transcend and develop critical thinking skills. The Creative Arts integrates the 3 languages of learning - the language of the mind, the language of the heart and the language of the hands in harmony and together.

Over the next 2 newsletters we would like to outline the opportunities provided at STA on the Creative Arts for students.

#### **School Music & Choir**

The school has a specialist Music teacher who teaches the music strand through weekly music lessons to each class. Furthermore, students have the opportunity to be involved in choral singing either through the Junior Choir (Years 2 & 3), Senior Choir (Years 5 & 6) or the Combined Choir. Currently there are over 100 students in these choral ensembles. The choir also consistently participated in the various combined Captivate Choir performances. A number of students from STA have been selected to sing in the Captive Voices ensemble.

#### **Band Program**

Through Captivate the school currently has 90 students involved in the school band program. The program provides weekly tuition to students in playing brass instruments and ensemble playing. In 2016 the Band hosted a visit and band workshop from the touring Assumption Primary School Bathurst Band which culminated in a combined performance.

#### Instrument Lessons from Local Music School

A number of students receive tuition in keyboard and guitar playing on a weekly basis provided by a local music school (Springwood School of Music). These lessons are hosted on school premises.
