Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

It is always interesting to examine the origins of words to better understand how language has been shaped over time by lived experience. The word "Hospitality" for instance comes from the Latin word hospes magning curiously both "host" and "quost"

word hospes, meaning curiously both "host" and "guest."

Seeing ourselves in an hospitable sense both as host and guest can bring a new perspective to our perception of the action of being hospitable. The Benedictine sister and social justice advocate Joan Chittister, says that "Hospitality is the way we turn a prejudiced world around, one heart at a time." Ultimately, hospitality needs to be lived in welcoming places.

Last week we concluded hosting our Kindergarten students and their families over 4 orientation visits. These visits are an important example of how we as a community welcome and build important relationships with the most recently arrived members of our school community. These "new" members have made a conscious decision to be part of this Catholic community.

The Kindergarten Orientation visits are always a great energiser at this time of the year, when things tend to be quite hectic. The visits fill our community with joy and new possibilities for the future.

At each of the 4 visits the Kindy children were personally met and welcomed by a current Year 5 student – their buddies next year. After shaking hands and introductions were completed each

Kindy child was presented with a name tag and then led down to the Kindergarten classrooms by their buddy student. Watching this relationship develop over the four visits was heartwarming and a tanaible sign of hospitality.

While our new students were engaged in various activities in the classrooms by our teaching team our new families were in the hall forging new friendships with each other and school staff including Sister Monica.

Also this year, during each visit various members of our teaching team shared some practical strategies for parents to use with their children in select areas of learning. The presentations included strategies on counting, oral language and music and the creative arts. From the positive feedback received these presentations were really valued by all those in attendance. We thank our numeracy specialist, Kathryn Cefai, Assistant Principal, Avril Llewellyn and music teacher, Leigha Wills for their expertise in presenting these brief sessions.

This Sunday we commence the Church's great season of Advent. During this season we recall that the angel told Joseph that the baby born of Mary would be Emmanuel, God-with-us. The season and all that takes place in preparation for Christmas is a reminder that Our God, Emmanuel – is, by choice, a guest in our homes and in our hearts.

### Annual Diocesan Tuition Fees - 2016

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fees can be paid upfront at the start of the year or as three equal payments in Terms 1, 2 and 3. The fee is only charged for the first three (3) children currently enrolled in the diocese (in other words there is no additional Diocesan Tuition Fee for the fourth child attending a systemic school in the diocese or other participating Catholic schools - see 'Sibling Discounts' below). To work out how much the fee is for each child, check the table below.

#### Annual Diocesan Building Levy - 2016

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). The levy for 2016 is \$735 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$245 payable in terms one, two and three.

#### Annual Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents – 2016

The Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents for 2016 is \$1,815 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$605 in terms one, two and three. The fee applies to new students on the following Visa numbers: 173, 401, 411, 415, 416, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 457, 459, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a per family basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.
