

This year marks the 95th anniversary of the opening of the first Catholic school in Springwood.

St Thomas Aquinas Parish School was opened in 1921 with a total enrolment of 24 students in the old church building located on Macquarie Road. The Sisters of St Joseph (order founded by St Mary of the Cross MacKillop) administered and taught at the school from its opening until 1976. The school relocated to its current location on Hawkesbury Road in 1982 adjacent to St Columba's Catholic College. The school now has a total enrolment of 615 students.

Recently we marked this milestone with a whole school photograph involving all students and staff. Our current Kindy and Year 1 students will be part of the centenary celebrations in 2021!



Parking Matters

Parents are reminded that the 'kiss and drop' zone in the church driveway is to be used as a drop-off point only and therefore is a no parking zone at all times. If a parent wishes to park and walk their child, they must use the marked parking spaces in the church car park. Similarly, there should be no cars waiting in this drop-off zone in the afternoon to pick-up a child. Whilst it is a safety issue, it also causes lengthy traffic delays along the church driveway.

Students must not be walking unaccompanied to the church car park or any other area on the parish site. All children should be collected in person and accompanied and supervised closely by parents/guardians to motor vehicles. The practice of having children wait for parents on kerbs adjacent to the car park is also potentially dangerous.

THIS IS A SAFETY ISSUE - THERE IS A HIGH VOLUME OF PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICLE TRAFFIC IN THE AFTERNOON.
