Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

Like most, the first prayer I ever learnt as a child was The Lord's Prayer – or the Our Father. The Lord's Prayer is unique as the only known prayer uttered by Jesus Christ himself.

For those old enough to remember, the Australian nun Sister Janet Mead even had a top-10 hit with her "pop" version of the prayer in 1974. It is significant that the Lord's Prayer, or Our Father, is the common prayer of all Christians around the world, regardless of denomination or languages.

Jesus presents a prayer that is simple in structure and practical in its intent. After an opening address, there are five petitions, two regarding the Father, touching on his name and his kingdom (now and in the future) and three relating to the needs of those offering the prayer:

- the provision of food spiritual and physical
- forgiveness ourselves and others
- protection.

In The Lord's Prayer Jesus presents us with a great prayer of community. We say "Our Father" not "My Father". It is a prayer

offered during the Mass prior to the sign of peace and the reception of the Eucharist. It is the prayer that many of us have turned to in times when prayer is difficult. The prayer that Christ gives us as an exemplar is one that opens us up to the action of God's Holy Spirit and directs us to act in love, forgiveness, friendship, compassion and service towards others.



The "Our Father" is a gift from Christ through the ages - the prayer of the Christian pilgrim, of all those who plod daily along life's journey. It is not only the first prayer we ever learnt but one that we can return to throughout our lives with humility and faith especially when praying is difficult.

In the week when we acknowledge and celebrate the example of our own Aussie Saint, St Mary of the Cross Mackillop, the Lord's Prayer remains a timeless expression of our deepest longing for love, charity and faith in the providence of God. Mary's example lived out through these acts as inspiration and hope for us in this time.

#### **Grandparents Day 2017**

This Friday our School will host Grandparents Day. The day seeks to honour in a special way the vital role that grandparents and other significant role models play in the lives of our children within our community. It is a day when we pause and give thanks to all grandparents as well as a day where grandparents have an opportunity to show their love, pride and appreciation for their children's children.

The role that grandparents play may be different from family to family but they all share an important role in helping to influence their grandchildren's growth and formation. Grandparents are a precious and essential part of our community. They help grandchildren better understand who they are by helping to convey faith, values and family traditions. Also by passing on stories about their own and their





# Wakakirri 2017

After many weeks of dedicated practice our Wakakirri troupe is entering in the final stages of preparation leading up to their performance next Friday evening at the Riverside Theatre. This year our school item is based on the life of Deng Thiak Adut, lawyer, refugee advocate, former child soldier in South Sudan and NSW Australian of the Year. The aim of Wakakirri is story-telling through characterisation, drama, dance and music. Many rehearsals have taken place during school breaks and in the holidays. We congratulate the students for their commitment to this project which seeks not only to entertain but also to educate, inspire and provoke. We also congratulate the many teachers involved, led by Michelle Nightingale, for their outstanding work.



# Teacher Supervision of Students – Before and After School

As outlined in the Parent Handbook, teacher supervision commences at 8.35am. Children arriving before this time are not supervised. Students arriving before 8.35am are required to gather under the school shelter and remain under the shelter until teacher supervision commences. Students have been instructed that the shelter area is a passive activity area during this time i.e. sitting, talking etc. Running activities or ball games are not permitted under the shelter before school. As also stated, afternoon teacher supervision concludes when the final bus leaves the school premises – approximately 3.50pm. Students who are not collected by parents/carers after this time will be directed to the school office until collected.

### Office Electronic Sign-in and Student Sign-in Book

Parents are reminded to **allow some extra time** to sign-in when visiting the school or collecting children early etc. as you will be required to sign-in on the **office IPad** before entering the premises and this process may take a few minutes, especially when signing-in for the first time. When leaving the school you will need to sign-out via the same IPad. Students **must be signed-in/out via the green** book at the office by a parent/carer for late arrival or early collection. No signature in book equates to an 'Unexplained' on student's attendance record. Thank you for your understanding.

### Changeover to New School Phone Number - 02 4723 3800

The school phone number is currently in the process of changing to a new digital number. Over the next few months callers may still use the old number which will automatically be diverted to the new number. Eventually, callers will receive a recorded message that the number has changed and they will need to dial the new number manually instead. This process will take approximately 18 months. When receiving a call from the school you will notice the new number (as above) now appears.

## Vietnam Veterans' Day – Sunday 13 August

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Day Parade and Service commemorates the Battle of Long Tan, the most significant engagement by Australian Forces during the Vietnam War on 18 August 1966. Each year on the closest Sunday, Vietnam Veterans gather at the War Memorial in Springwood for a commemorative service and wreath laying ceremony. This year the event will start with the march and service in Macauarie Road, Springwood from 11.30am next Sunday, 13 August.



As in previous years students from our school will be marching and laying a wreath in remembrance. Students wishing to participate need to meet school staff in front of the St George Bank/St Vincent de Paul Shop on Macquarie Road by 11.00am. Students will need to wear their full winter school uniform for this occasion and may wear medals in honour of family members who have served.
