It was a real privilege recently to join our Year 6 students and their teachers on camp. The 3 days away living in community was a most positive, instructive and uplifting time for all. Camp is an important rite of passage for our senior students in their final year of their primary school journey. 

Pentecost Celebrations

Recently we celebrated a beautiful, joyful liturgy marking the birthday of the Church at Pentecost. The liturgy provided our school community with an

opportunity to pray and reflect on the gift of God's own Spirit that was given to the world in that upper room more than 2000 years ago.



The coming of the Holy Spirit filled the disciples with spiritual attributes or gifts that transformed them from scared and lost individuals to people who were filled with courage and wisdom, and united them in love to live out and proclaim the Good News to the world.

One of the central symbols of the Holy Spirit is the element of fire. In the biblical context the phenomena of fire is always a sign of a powerful presence heralding a chance event. In our Australian context fire has played an important part in the beliefs, rituals and survival of our indigenous people and their relationship with the land. Fire is an agent of new growth, renewal and purification.

Just like on the day of Pentecost, the Spirit often works within our common everyday life in ways that sometimes can be hard to comprehend. The challenge for us is working out where the Holy Spirit is

leading us. This requires us to use the Gifts of the Spirit and to discern what is true, good and important.

In our ordinary daily lives the Spirit is present and at work whenever LOVE, JOY, PEACE, COMPASSION, FORGIVENESS, and GENTLENESS are lived out. These "Fruits of the Spirit" reveal themselves in relationship with others and frequently catch us by surprise.

Student Sign-in/out Book Reminders

When students arrive late to school or leave early they **must be signed-in/out by the adult who brought them to/collected from school**. We ask that when parents/carers use this <u>green sign-in/out book</u> at the office, they write **each child's details on a separate line** and include the **reason for** late arrival/early departure and **parent/carer signature**. If a signature or a reason is not provided, then the child's partial absence will be entered as UNEXPLAINED and parents will be sent a note requesting an explanation. The book is a <u>legal record of student attendance</u>, as is the class roll, and these partial absences will appear on your child's school learning report.
