Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

From Week 7 I will return to my father's village in Italy to spend precious time with family. The township has changed much since my parents migrated to Australia in the mid-1950s.

Village life of that era typically meant that aunts, uncles, grandmothers, grandfathers and cousins would all contribute their wisdom and assistance to the raising of the young. Homes such as the one in which my father was raised (pictured) contained a large extended family unit with multiple generations. Each member of the extended family had defined roles, responsibilities and influence on raising of the young.



Contemporary life is more nuclear, materially more affluent and technologically savvy. What modern families often crave as they set about raising their own children is a sense of community.

A sense of community can look different depending on where you live but there are generally four conditions that 'make' community a reality:

- belonging
- inclusion
- fulfilment
- attachment

More than 20 years ago in 1996, just as the internet was being established, Hillary Rodham Clinton published a book based on the African proverb: *It takes a village to raise a child*. In the book Hillary Clinton points to the village being no longer so much a geographical place as the network of values and relationships that support and affect our lives and the lives of our children. *It Takes a Village* makes it clear that the choices we make today about how we raise our children and how we support families will determine how we will nurture and support communities now and into the future.

As I reflect on the notion of what the "village" looks like to us I think of the countless, often unpublicised acts of compassion, love and generosity that occur within our midst each week and the gracious generosity expressed in very practical ways. These acts not only contribute to raising our young but also provide them with a model of what community looks like.

In our 'STA community' Sister Monica is a wonderful embodiment of what is virtuous about true community values and relationships. For more than 23 years Sister Monica Armstrong sgs has been ministering within our "STA Village".

Each morning Monica is present before school, catching up with students and parents as the school day commences. During the course of the year she visits the homes of all new families to the school as well as re-visiting many other families through invitation. These simple but convivial home visits form a vital link between school, Parish, home and faith. Sister Monica avails herself generously and is compassionate and gracious to all she encounters.

Sister Monica exemplifies the true essence of the 'Good Samaritan' and our school motto 'Love One Another'. May we continue to be inspired to continue to follow Monica's

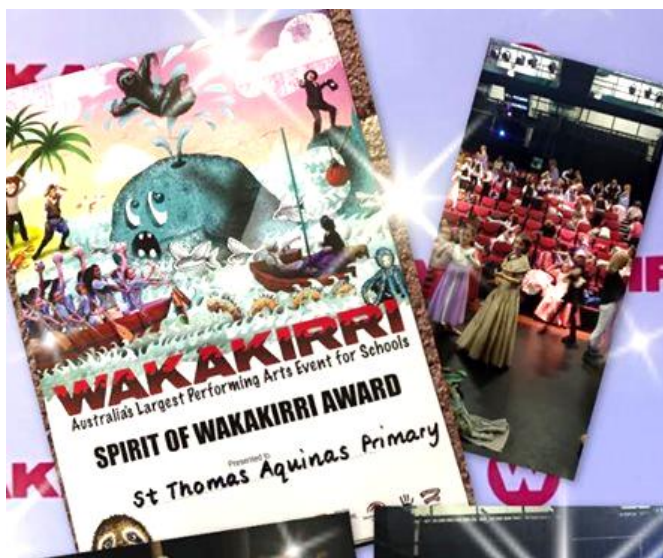

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Safe Arrival & Departure by Car

Morning Drop Off

Option 1: Parents may use the Church car park. The area adjacent to the gravel pathway may be only used as a "Kiss & Drop" area – parents are not to park their vehicle in this area. If a parent wishes to park and walk their child, they must use the marked parking spaces in the Church car park. **Important: Parents are not permitted to drive into the school bus bay area at any time.**

Option 2: Parents may choose to park on St Columba's Drive, opposite the school. However, parents **are not** permitted to STOP or PARK their vehicle between the NO STOPPING signs at and near the pedestrian crossing. Infringements may incur a fine or loss of points. Parents are asked to accompany children across the pedestrian crossing and access the school via the small gate and pathway. Children are not to be dropped off in or near the opening of the bus bay, nor enter the school via the bus bay opening. **There is no pedestrian access into the bus bay.**

Afternoon Pick Up

All children being collected from school must be collected from the silver seats adjacent to St Columba's Drive.

Note: Parents must attend the office if collecting children early. Students will be called to the office by admin staff in these instances and must be signed-out of the green book.

Parents may park on St Columba's Drive, on the side opposite the school (adhering to the signage outlined above). Children are not to leave the school via the school bus bay opening. Parents may also park in the marked parking bays in the Church car park, then walk to the silver seats to collect their child/children. **There is no pedestrian access into the bus bay.**

Teacher Supervision of Students – Before and After School

As outlined in the Parent Handbook, teacher supervision commences at 8.35am. Children arriving before this time will not be supervised. Students arriving before 8.35am are required to gather under the school shelter and remain under the shelter until teacher supervision commences. Students understand that the shelter area is a **passive activity area** during this time i.e. sitting, talking etc. **Running activities or ball games are not permitted under the shelter before school.** As also stated, afternoon teacher supervision concludes when the final bus leaves the school premises – approximately 3.40pm. Students who are not collected by parents/carers after this time will be directed to the school office until collected.

Mountains Live

Last week students from Year 5 and 6 experienced Mountains Live event. Following the Voice of Youth competition students from the four mountains Catholic Primary Schools gathered together in our Church for a different experience of 'Church'. The Catholic Youth Team led by James Camden gave the children a Spirit-filled afternoon of song and prayer. All present enjoyed the testimony of Mollie Bauerhuit, St Columba's School Captain and ex-student of STA, who spoke so beautifully of her faith experiences. They all left charged to be witnesses of God in each other's lives, through the gifts of the Holy Spirit.
