Dear St Thomas Aquinas Families,

Sunday 1 December marked the beginning of the Liturgical Year and the start of ADVENT. This liturgical season consists of four Sundays starting with Sunday closest to November 30th.

The word advent is derived from the Latin "adventus" which means "coming" or "arrival." During the Roman Empire, the word adventus referred to the arrival of a person of dignity and great power - a king or emperor. For Christians, Advent is the time when we prepare for the threefold coming of Jesus Christ – past, present, and future.

In the song Living Proof by the American artist Bruce Springsteen, he sings about the transformational joy of discovering the purity of LOVE as he watches the birth of his first child. Any parent who has been present at the nativity of their child can certainly relate to this life-changing event.

Well now on a summer night, oh in a dusky room Come a little piece of the Lord's undying light Crying like he swallowed the fiery moon In his mother's arms it was all the beauty I could take Like the missing words to some prayer that I could never make Oh, in a world so hard and dirty so fouled and confused Searching for a little bit of God's mercy I found living proof

It is through living out being Christ to each other, that we touch the heart of the meaning of the festive season.

Advent reminds us that God's living proof of Himself was not done in an abstract way but through the reality of His incarnation as a fledgling baby.

As Christians our mission is to bring the message of Christ to others in our daily encounters in real and practical applications of the Good News. As St Francis says, "Preach the Gospel at all times, and if necessary use words". By doing so we touch the heart of the meaning of the Christmas season.

The Franciscan priest Richard Rohr says, God comes to us disguised as our lives. In other words, are we able to recognise the incarnate God not just as an historical figure but also through our encounter with others? Like the Magi, are we looking for God in the right places? Do we recognise God in others particularly in moments of life that encompass compassion as well as joy?

On Friday 6 December we came together as a school community to mark the beginning of Advent with a beautiful and reverent liturgical celebration. Through scripture, drama and music the students, parents and staff prayed to enter into this season of preparation for the birth of Christ. During the liturgy two members of the local St Vincent De Paul Society, Toni and Paul Condon were able to speak to us about how we can assist their charity work at this time of the year to help those in our community in real need.

Wishing all the blessings of the Advent season and may we recognise the Christ-child as He arrives in our lives each day with our heart, head and hands.
